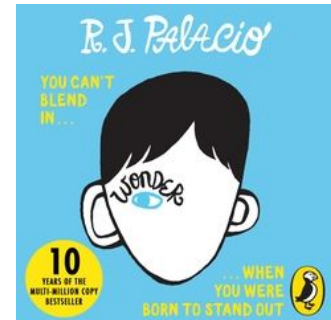
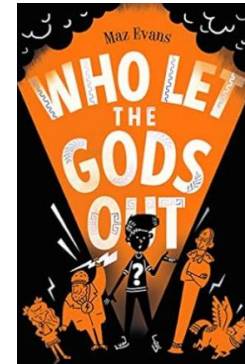
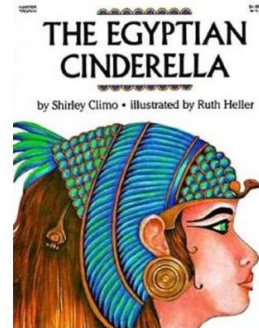
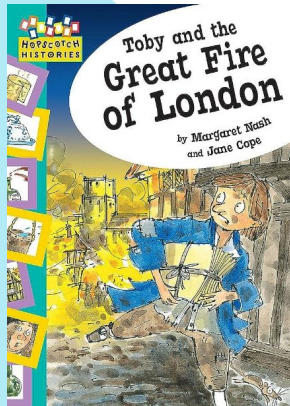
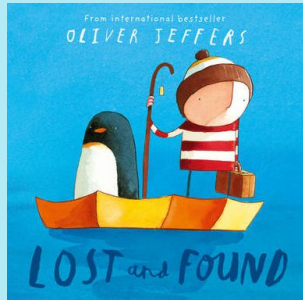


What can I do?

- 1.** Use pure sounds rather than letter names.
- 2.** Use Fred Talk to help your child to read and spell words.
- 3.** Listen to your child read their Storybook every day.
- 4.** Read stories to your child every day.

What happens when children come off the Read, Write Inc. programme?

- Children take part in whole class guided reading sessions led by their class teacher.
- They study one or two books in depth each half term. These are linked to the topic they are studying as well and explored further in writing lessons. Over the year they will read a range of rich and diverse texts.

Accelerated Reader

- Children who are no longer part of the phonics programme are assessed using Accelerated Reader. They take a quiz in school and receive a range. Children are then able to select a book within that range to read both in class and at home.
- Children will read this book to an adult in school each week.
- They should practise at home at least 3 times weekly.
- When children have finished their book they complete a quiz to check their understanding before they can move on to another book.

Class and School Library

- Our class and school libraries contain a large selection of both fiction and non-fiction books.
- Classes now have a weekly library slot and are able to choose any book they like to share at home. These are books that they may not be able to read completely by themselves.
